 - o Attended by Peter, Russell, and Lexcia
 - o Most examples were free verse
 - o Prompts and some ways of looking at poetry and its purpose and messages
 - O Lexcia was taken by blackout poetry (where a piece of text is taken, then words are blacked out, and the words remaining become a poem
 - O Russell was taken by a poem written in 2 voices that could be read 3 ways. Each of the two voices was written in 2 columns. Each column could be read as a single poem, then they could be read line by line, each column in turn, like a conversation or read as a third poem, ignoring the column spacing column
